#### COUNCIL

With the arrival of spring, the Council will be moving on a few projects that have been deferred until Pastor Sarah and our new council members were in place. We have long recognized that one of our greatest assets in serving our community is our facility. Additionally, renting the fellowship hall with the kitchen for events or weekly meetings can raise a significant amount of revenue. There are two items that we will be working to resolve before we can make it available.

First, the kitchen appliances have to be serviced and repaired as needed and kitchen supplies will have to be purchased and inventoried.

Second, we will be seeking a kitchen coordinator to put together a team to prepare the kitchen for events. We will also be reviewing interest rates earned on our accounts to increase interest revenue if possible.



All are welcome to join us, whether or not you attend religious services or identify with a faith community. We meet once a month at various locations.



Jesus' disciples met in a locked room. Suddenly Jesus stood with them! He said "Peace be with you."


Connect the dots to find a church symbol for peace.

Did you know that Easter is not just one day? The season of Easter lasts for weeks! This is wonderful news!


Count the crosses, the eggs, and the butterflies. Add them all together and you'll know how many days are in the Easter season.
