

Roll Call

A sign-up sheet was passed to congregants who were in-person. Darcie Price recorded names on a sign-up sheet as members confirmed their verbal & hearing attendance via Zoom. 41 confirmed members in attendance and via Zoom.

Approval of the Agenda



I find it helpful to use this forum as a sounding board for new ideas and as an opportunity to learn from other churches with common objectives.

As we begin 2025, I am grateful for the guidance and providence of our Lord, Jesus Christ in clearing the way for Pastor Sarah to accept our call, in restoring stability to the ministries of Celebration, and in instilling the confidence to embrace the blessings and challenges this new year will bring.



Ministry in Daily Life

Altar Guild & Liturgical Arts Team

Each season of the church year has corresponding colors and symbols that are intended to help us focus on the themes of the season. For example, Pentecost and Reformation are associated with red. These are days that are full of the Holy Spirit, symbolized by fire and movement. On the other hand, Advent is a time characterized by waiting for Christ's birth while still in the dark. This season's color is blue while Christmas is white, representing the dark that transitions to the light of the coming of Christ.

The Altar Guild are the dedicated volunteers who track the church calendar and attend to the changing of banners and other elements of color and art throughout the church year. Many thanks to Jacki Seale and Judy Hussey who comprise the core of our Altar Guild team.

This year, the Liturgical Arts team was rebooted thanks to a grant from our synod. The Liturgical Arts team are a collection of artistic people who are motivated to express their love of Christ in Celebration's sanctuary for the various seasons of the church year.

The team began with a focus on Advent, starting in September 2024. The kick-off was a day retreat at the Grunewald Guild led by Terry Valdez. The day was focused on playing with art and playing with the themes of Advent and Creation, focusing on John 1 and Genesis 1.

The team ultimately created an enchanting Advent installation that reflected the dark mystery of waiting for Christ, as well as the promise of God's overflowing energy of new life coming into being. Each week, elements were added in relationship with the Advent candles. The liturgy also reflected these additions week of Faith, Hope, Peace, and Love.

The congregation was amazed and deeply appreciative of the team's creation and how it added to the meaning of the season. One of the special first impressions that I have of Wenatchee as we arrived eleven years ago is the slogan on their welcome sign on Wenatchee Ave. "Meeting Rivers, Meeting Friends, Meeting Needs". I remember thinking how fulfilling it might be to be a part of such a community while at the same time realizing that it's probably just a slogan. Each year I learn more about how it's not just a slogan but is a part of Wenatchee's culture.

Those of us on the Outreach ministry team see this repeatedly in the generosity of the members of our congregation. Individual donations have been received throughout the year for our Packing Friendships Ministry, individuals and the outreach committee donated \$ 1,500 to help the Reyes family recover from a house fire, and nearly \$ 4,000 was contributed through the Brunch Church and the Outreach Auction.

Our congregation has not only donated financially, but their time as well. This past year you have supported our Packing Friendships Ministry that delivers 26 bags of food each week to children experiencing food insecurity within the Headstart program and 21 bags each week to children at Grant Elementary School. The bags are delivered late in the week so that the children have some nourishment to see them through the weekend. Each bag costs \$3.65/child/week. You have not only funded this ministry but have helped with packing bags after the Sunday service. A special thanks to Cal and Terry Johns and George and Mary Herring-Bywater for purchasing food and making weekly deliveries to the schools.

Our congregation has also been directly involved in supporting the Second Harvest Food Truck. It is paid for through the Outreach fund and relies upon volunteers to set up, fill, and distribute boxes of groceries to the local community. And near year end, this congregation came together to donate 52 coats, gloves and hats to pass on to the Lighthouse ministries for the homeless and the Wenatchee Rescue Mission.

The Outreach Committee donates to various local ministries that provide assistance to those in need throughout our community. We have supported Serve Wenatchee ministries, Communities in Schools, and sponsored participants in the Sunshine Bowling League (a Wenatchee bowling league set up for the physically disabled).

Volunteering alongside members of Celebration in our Outreach ministry, I can appreciate the meaning of our slogan.

Spiritual Growth

Youth

As of the end of 2024, our confirmation class has four students. They are digging deeper into the stories of the Bible in greater depth as they begin to explore their own faith and understanding of God. Confirmation is a time for asking questions and learning, as well as having fun and making friends. Starting in 2024, Rev. Alan Oppelaar took the lead in teaching our confirmation students. Alan is a retired Methodist pastor and has a passion for teaching youth. Thank you for joining in the fun, Rev. Alan!

Youth Group

Celebration has several high school students who have been confirmed in the past two years. This group gathers after church to have conversations with Pr. Sarah about what they heard in church on a given Sunday, what's going on in their lives, and have an opportunity to ask questions and received support for all they are going through. Our high school youth are also involved in skits and retreats with our younger kids, reading in church, music, attending retreats, and participating in service projects.

Fall Youth Retreat

Celebration's youth ministry team hosted a retreat at Camas Meadows in November 2024 for nine middle school and high school aged youth. Pr. Sarah, Pr. Alan, Pr. Dave, and LeAnn all came together to support our kids in learning and playing. The theme of the retreat was Ruach, which is the Hebrew word for both spirit and breath. We focused on breath prayer and breath techniques for managing stress, as well as learning how the Spirit surrounds us, just like the oxygen we breathe.



Worship and Music

Worship in 2024 at Celebration has been full of meaningful moments of reflection, celebration, and connection with each other and our loving God.

Worship Committee and Preparation

The Worship Committee meets every two months to plan the music selections for each service. The Worship Committee in 2024 is Annie Chalmers, Kathy Jo Evans, Susan Gubsch, Pam Wallis, and Pastor Sarah. For each week's service, Pastor Sarah gathers material from primarily Lutheran worship resources, along with the Worship Committee's music selection, to craft weekly and special services. The scripture readings are usually from the Revised Common Lectionary, which most major denominations use around the world.









Livestream and Online

Our faithful technology gurus, Steve and Liz Arbaugh, managed the online worship transition from Livestream/Vimeo to YouTube. This transition took hours of learning and perfecting the technology. Thank you, Steve and Liz! And thank you to all our other volunteers and those at home learned a new way of doing things. Darcie is continuing to provide bulletins online each week for those watching from home. Pastor Sarah also posts the texts of her sermons, along with the lectionary readings and service recording as a blog on the website each week. These blog posts are easily shared and see some of the highest traffic on our website, as people are engaging with God's Word at home.





Volunteer Helpers

Worship requires many hands! Every week, one of our youth helps with lighting the candles (acolyte), while others help with communion. We also have readers, greeters, ushers, and communion assistants to help people feel comfortable, welcome, and be fed at the Lord's table. You are always welcome to get involved with worship!








Lent and Easter


Many thanks to Pastor Alex!

Brunch Church

North Central Washington Cluster Meetings

Celebration hosted a cluster meeting in the spring of 2024 for the pastors of our local ELCA congregations which include, Faith Lutheran in Leavenworth, Grace Lutheran in Wenatchee, Fullness of God in Holden Village, Lake Chelan Lutheran in Chelan, St. Paul's Lutheran in Quincy, and Holy Trinity in Ephrata. Retired pastors and pastors working in specialized ministry also attend cluster meetings. Pastor Sarah also attended a second cluster meeting in 2024 at Lake Chelan Lutheran in Chelan in the summer of 2024. Rev. Paul Polumbo is the Dean of our cluster, who helps connect Celebration with the synod. In addition, Rev. Polumbo is a source of support and resources for Celebration.

Cluster Text Study

Many of the cluster pastors located in Wenatchee, Leavenworth, and Cashmere gather for a weekly text study in preparation for Sunday preaching. These text studies are attended by both retired and active pastors for fellowship, faith formation, and sermon preparation. Many of our area's "retired" pastors continue to provide pulpit supply, pastoral care support, and engagement in social services.



2024 NWIM Synod Assembly

The Northwest Intermountain Synod hosted a series of regional gatherings to help people gather across the synod. Elaine and Brandt Smith attended the synod assembly, along with Pastor Sarah. Bishop Meggan Manlove led the gathering, sharing news, stories, and encouragement for all in attendance. Worship was led by Rev. Liv Andrews (Director of Evangelical Mission). Grace Pomroy walked us through re-imagining stewardship and strategies for funding small congregations while serving the community. The gathering was held at First Lutheran Church in Ellensburg, Washington.

First Call Theological Education

As a new pastor, Pr. Sarah is required to attend the ELCA region's First Call Theological Education retreat for three years. This year's retreat was located at Seabeck Conference Center on Hood Canal. It was a beautiful three days of meeting new pastors from Oregon, Idaho, Washington, and Alaska. The keynote speaker for the event was Rev. Tim Brown (Director of Congregational Stewardship), with a focus on the spirituality of stewardship. Four of the five bishops of Region 1 were in attendance; Rev. Dr. Meggan Manlove, Rev. Shelley Bryan Wee, Rev. Richard E. Jaech, and Rev. Tim Oslovich.

Bishop's Convocation

The Bishop's Convocation was held in Walla Walla in October of 2024. The focus of this retreat was a study of Leviticus led by Rev. Dr. Rachel Renn. Pastors from across our beautiful synod gathered to pray, worship, be in community, and learn. Pr. Sarah, along with other pastors of our synod, visited the Whitman National Historic Site. This site is of major historic importance in the story of white settlers coming to this region and beyond.







Adult Education

Most Sundays at 9am, adult learners gather before service to engage in deepening their faith, connecting with each other, and learning about the Bible, church history, theological ideas, and larger issues. The Adult Forum enhances worship by engaging in the themes of the church calendar.

January

Pr. Alex Schmidt led Adult Forum through January, focusing on the intersection of personal stories, histories, and God's Word.

February & March

During Lent, Adult Forum was focused on the story of Jesus' life and death in the Holy Land. The ELCA Sumud ministry provided videos, scripture, and discussion topics to help people see and experience the places of Jesus' life in the context of today's political reality in the Holy Land. Sumud is an Arabic word meaning steadfastness and "resistance through existence."

April & July

If you can believe it, the Adult Forum focused on one book after Easter until a break from adult education in August! The Adult Forum had expressed an interest to learn more about the Bible. So, we read Inspired by Rachel Held Evans together, which is an exploration of how to read and interpret the Bible, along with an overview of all the different genres of writing in the Bible.







September

During September, we read through the shortest book of the Bible, the Book of Ruth. We explored the meaning of hesed, a Hebrew word that means steadfast love...sort of. It means so much more than what

our English language can hold without writing paragraphs. It is the kind of love that Christ showed us and is the kind of love we are encouraged to give. Read this short book of the Bible and wonder about the role of hesed in the lives of these characters and your life!

October

In preparation for Reformation Sunday, we explored the history of the Reformation. We asked questions like, what was going on in medieval Europe? What on earth was the church up to? Why was Luther and many others so fed up? And what were the ramifications of the Reformation that we all experience every day. Hint...it's bigger than just our Protestant church experience.

Advent

We explored the themes of Advent for justice and new life in our world through the teachings in Jeremiah. This was a study written for Advent by the theologian Rev. Dr. Walter Brueggemann.

Practicing Resurrection

Pr. Sarah offered a mini-retreat for folks who want to go deeper in their faith journey in a small group. The theme of the retreat was Practicing Resurrection. God's action in our life is always bringing us into new life through the many little deaths we experience in the world. While God is acting in our lives and we can deepen our participation through spiritual practices, listening, and sharing.



Holden Village Retreat

In July 2024, members and friends of Celebration visited Holden Village for a week of learning, worship, and relaxation in the mountains. We had the opportunity to hike, play games, nap, work on art projects, sit in the library, or attend sessions on theological approaches to the challenges of our modern world, geology, and poetry. Children & Family Ministry

Our Sunday School continues to be a place where young students can come and explore their faith with lessons directly from the Bible. We ended the school year last May with our Sparks curriculum, which took us through some of the key stories in the Bible. During the summer, many of our students attended Vacation Bible School in a cooperative venture with several churches in our area, held at Grace Lutheran Church.



We started up again in September with a new curriculum from Concordia. We studied the story of Creation and worked our way through the Old Testament to the Exodus and Moses. We paused then and skipped to the New Testament to study the story of Jesus' birth. We will return to finish the Old Testament and then delve into the New Testament in the New Year.

All our stories reinforce and teach the students more about their Savior and Lord. The students are anxious to hear, relate things they already know, and ask questions to further their understanding. Each lesson involves a story from the Bible, activities and puzzles, and a Bible verse to memorize.

Each Sunday the students recite those verses, usually with 100% participation. "I have stored up your word in my heart." Psalm 119:11. It is such a privilege to be a part of the growth of these young minds as they explore their faith.

We also practiced and contributed to the Christmas Service on Dec. 15th and were delighted to bring this message to the congregation. Dressed in Nativity costumes, the children sang, recited, and played bells to honor the birth of their King. It was a wonderful program, and the students did an exceptional job.

The last two months also gave us the opportunity to fill 6 boxes for Operation Christmas Child. Our involvement led the church to participate and contribute 22 boxes for children to receive as, perhaps, their only presents this Christmas. What a wonderful way to share God's love!

Our Sunday School has a regular attendance of about 9-15 students each Sunday. We are very thankful to have families that regularly bring their children to class. We are also very thankful for each of these inquisitive, delightful children who want to learn more about the stories in the Bible, the church, and how they can share that message with others. We welcome any children that would like to hear more about Jesus and spend time with other students who know and love Jesus.

More than 300 hundred community members attended.




Visiting Angels

WSU & Celebration's Collaborative Community Garden

The 2024 (third season) collaboration between Celebration and the WSU Extension, WSU SNAP-Ed Nutrition Education Program, and the Chelan-Douglas Master Gardener Program successfully filled all 27 community garden plots in addition to the north garden. Mr. Gonzalez retired from gardening this year, passing on his garden plot to a neighbor of his, that continued to share produce in Mr. Gonzalez's neighborhood, just like he did. We thanked Mr. Gonzalez with hugs and handshakes for his contribution and blessings to Celebration spanning over 11 years.

The focus of this collaboration is to open up the ability to reach people of limited income with families living in housing projects, apartments or small homes that do not have access to garden areas. With the addition of the Master Gardeners & SNAP-Ed Nutrition educators, their goal was in teaching gardening skills and how to plant a garden that provides a healthy opportunity to eat more fresh fruits and vegetables, increase exercise and supplement the family income. Involving children in the gardening project taught them about family projects, how their food is grown and the enjoyment from eating fresh foods. Educational handouts in English and Spanish were provided by the WSU Extension office & Master Gardeners. Each Wednesday evening during the growing season, SNAP-Ed Nutrition educators and the Master Gardener volunteers taught cooking & gardening classes. These classes are available to anyone who wants to come learn about gardening.

The 2024 community garden proved to be the smoothest operating, most productive and rewarding year yet. We've learned a lot, both gardeners and facilitators to be able to enjoy the fruits of labor. Cal Johns was diligent in maintaining and fixing various irrigation issues, communicating various tasks needing attention and assisting Darcie in all "things" garden. Celebration had a fairly even mix of seasoned gardeners and new gardeners. We learned throughout the season that a real life meaningful community has been forming and blossoming amongst the gardeners over the last 3 seasons. The gardeners uplift/ advise/support one another and have made friendships beyond the garden. They have also blessed Celebration with their produce, the care for the land, helping Darcie & Cal with various garden tasks (like caring for the raspberry patch & rhubarb, mowing & weed eating) and being the "eyes & ears" for the land when we are not here.

We had a generous donation of compost at the end of the season from WintonMFG. Compost Works in Leavenworth. If you are interested in providing food wastes to WintonMFG Compost project, you can sign-up at https://www.wintonmfg.com. Celebration is a drop-off/pick-up site for WintonMFG within our community. The buckets and info are in Darcie's office, once you have signed-up.

Looking ahead to 2025's community garden, provides many opportunities to serve and be blessed by the families, friends & many different community members at Celebration's property. Almost all the garden plots have been spoken for already.

You are encouraged to come to the garden, walk about, take pictures, pick some weeds or just visit with gardeners. We are all a part of the bounty!

Financial

The 2024 Statement of Financial Income and Expense are reviewed in 2 parts, the General Operations Fund beginning on the next page and the Designated Funds on the following. These two reports state the income and expense for each fund, the general fund captures the categories only. You will find a full detailed account of income and expense along with some historical data following the brief reports. The General Operations Fund includes all daily income and expenses of Celebration. In addition to the income & expense reports, there are many historical documents through-out the finance pages of this Annual Report. There is a monthly finance report in the Newsletter and a snapshot in the council meeting minutes posted by the office doors. If any one has any questions in regards to the daily financial works of Celebration Lutheran Church, I encourage you to come and visit with me.

2024 Income for the General Operations Fund: General Contributions came in under budget significantly at \$12,559. Building Use donations were over budget by \$1350 due to conservative budgeting on building use. Mortgage was paid in full in July, 2023. Their have been some challenges with the city planning that did not allow us to receive any Rental Income in 2024. Our budgeted income for 2024 was \$211,352 and the total General Income for 2024 was \$198,860 after the interest, building use donations and processing fee donations were added. The overall Income for the General Fund for 2024 is one of the lowest that I have experienced in my time with Celebration.

2024 Expenses for the General Operations Fund: Celebration has continued to see increased prices of our everyday expenses, just as many of you have, and additional maintenance fees for some aging systems such as HVAC. Even with increases most of the expense line items came in on or under budget. General Operations Fund expenses totaled \$219,677.73 compared to our budgeted expenses of \$228,045.71 resulting in our total expenses being under budget by \$8,367.98.

General Operations Fund Balance: 2024 ended with a fund balance loss of \$20,817.73 in the General Fund. 2024 was a new Chapter in the story of Celebration Lutheran Church with the hiring of Pastor Sarah Toney. We budgeted for some unknowns, not exactly knowing what income gains or losses we would have. Our budgeted General Fund loss was \$16,993.71 about \$4100 less than the actual fund loss. 2024 has an ending Fund Balance of \$89,673.78. We have a budget (2025) of roughly \$20,500 in monthly expenses which equates to just over 4 months of funds in the General Fund Balance. This is the lowest recommendation for a fund balance I give (4 to 5 months of regular monthly expenses) to both you, The Congregation, and the Council. Healthy Fund Balances are maintained by consistent monthly incomes, ministries keeping tabs on their budgets and volunteers giving of their time & resources to help keep the costs of maintenance and other expenses down. As expenses continue to increase and the building ages, meaning more cost for maintenance in addition to less volunteer type services that we now budget for, a consistent and steady flow of income is needed to keep the budget inline. The fund balance continues to be an area that I watch carefully and report to council on regularly.

2025

Celebration Council & staff have made some wonderful tools available to help the congregation continue their regular giving! You can mail your contribution, use the **GIVE** button that can be found on the Celebration Lutheran Church website (clcewen.org) or sign up for the **Simply Giving Automatic Plan**. Give the church office a call if you would like to give it a try or need assistance.

2025 General Operating Fund Budget

The planning & budgeting for 2025 was like opening a new chapter of a great story. The budget reflects the upcoming hopes and dreams of the Council and the Celebration Family, to encourage families & youth within our congregation, allow for community engagement & outreach, in addition to meeting our commitments to care for our building, grounds and staff.

There was a focus on increasing our General Fund line items for our youth & family ministries adding the Sunday School Director, Confirmation Director and Nursery attendant, previously paid by grants and designated fund, into the General Fund. It also includes a Janitorial/Maintenance position in our paid staff rather than using an outside cleaning company or hiring out for the maintenance items within the building.

General Fund budgeted Income for 2025 is \$236,690. The General Contributions have increased from 2024 due to additional commitments after a Stewardship Campaign. The Rental Income reflects a partnership with another non-profit that would utilize our amazing kitchen space. Building Use is those who give a donation to use our facility and the Interest Income reflects our investment and savings account interest.

General Fund budgeted Expenses of \$246,375 is about \$26,700 more than what was actually spent in 2024 and reflects the items I have spoken of above. We continue to budget in hopes that the Celebration Family may seriously consider increased giving and that expenses will come in lower than budgeted while still being realistic. If things go exactly as budgeted the ending fund balance for 2025 will come in just under \$80,000 giving about 4 months of monthly expenses in our fund.

I continue to be grateful for the opportunity to work with the wonderful people of Celebration in continuing to bless this congregation, community and world in Mission!

Dear Friends in Christ,

Our synod staff and synod council have been using the phrase Wellsprings of God's Love to describe ministries across the beautiful and vast Northwest Intermountain Synod. In our two-page document about what we do together as a synod, you'll read, "As the waters of our synod all flow into streams and creeks that run into the Snake and Columbia Rivers, our ministry sites make up a watershed proclaiming the life-giving gospel of Jesus Christ." Using the phrase Wellsprings of God's Love is meant to be descriptive, not prescriptive. In other words, we do not want to give you one more thing to do or be. The phrase comes out of who you already are, which our staff observes as we travel throughout the synod. Furthermore, a wellspring implies abundance, and we trust that such abundance is possible because of God's love made known to us through Jesus Christ. Whether you are in a rural community or a more urban area, your ministry might feel isolated; you are not. The waters above ground and the aquifers below keep us connected as one synod, one church. Wellsprings are not isolated, and neither are our ministries!

Our scripture guide for Wellsprings of God's Love comes from John chapter 4: Jesus' encountering the woman at the well. Jesus uses the phrase "living water" for the Holy Spirit that meets people's thirst for life in relationship with God. Ultimately, that is what ministries in our Northwest Intermountain Synod do, help people be in relationship with the loving God we worship. Whatever that looks like in your context, thank you! And thank you also for your gifts of Mission Support. Because of Mission Support from congregations like yours, our entire synod can collectively help people build and strengthen their relationships with God.

When we gather online for our Synod Assembly, Saturday, May 3, we will use John 4:7-15 as our central text. Further along in the story, in verse 29, the woman says to the people in her city, "Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?"

As you celebrate the ministries in your own congregation from the past year and look ahead to the new year, I encourage you individually and collectively to wonder and commit to who you will proclaim, "Come and see!" Who in your sphere of family and friends has no idea that a Wellspring of God's Love even exists? Who needs a place of welcome? Who has no clue that God's love is absolutely without a doubt for them? Who is parched from the daily grind of life? Telling someone about God's love can be scary. Inviting someone to join you for worship or a potluck might be overwhelming. Consider how you have experienced your congregation, or one like it, as a Wellspring of God's Love. That is your story, your truth. And then you can be bold to say, "Come and see!"
