Hello, friends! I don't know about you, but I'm already feeling that familiar tug of war in my that happens every holiday season. On one hand, I want to be calm, peaceful, and lean into the contemplation that Advent brings. I'd love to settle into long conversations with folks and be present to the gratitude I feel for the gifts of life. On the other hand, I look at the to-do lists and I want to give up on responsibility and stay in bed. UGH! I love Christmas cards from family and friends. I don't want to send them. I love good food for our feast days, but who is going to make it all? It's the perennial tug-of-war we can all feel in life and in this season in particular.

So, in the midst of a moment of holiday resistance recently, I saw the FedEx guy delivering packages in my neighborhood with Christmas music already playing loudly from his truck. It was the classic tune "Last Christmas" by Wham, which we will all hear way too often by the time we get to December 25th and here he was listening to it alone and voluntarily! Now, the FedEx guy will be absolutely exhausted by December 25th simply by doing his job, not counting all the other obligations of life he is needing to balance that I know nothing of. And in that moment, I thought perhaps I need to stop being such a Scrooge. If the FedEx guy has the joy of the season so alive in him that he's listening to Last Christmas before Thanksgiving, then maybe I too can set down my grouchiness and lean into the gifts of the season. After all, who will be working harder during this time than the brave folks managing all of the logistics of package delivery?

This FedEx driver acted as Christ to me in that small moment, reminding me of to watch and look for joy and be thankful for the goodness of life. I was reminded that cynicism is indeed thin nourishment when we have the hope of Christ and the gifts of Advent to explore and rest in. In the midst of struggle, in the midst of the dark days of winter and snow, we watch for the hope, peace, joy, and love of Christ's birth. Watch and you too will find these gifts in unexpected places, like me and the FedEx driver.

I give thanks for the love of Christ that imbues our community and knits us together. I give thanks for you, that you were born, and that you live in community with Celebration Lutheran. May this coming season of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany be full of Christ's surprising and life-giving gifts for you and your loved ones.

#### **OUTREACH MINISTRY**

The demand for human services has exploded over the past few months with the government shutdown and the change in priorities outlined in the current federal budget. At the same time the Serve Wenatchee offices flooded from a break in their fire sprinkler system causing the loss of inventory and requiring a move to East Wenatchee while their space is restored.

With many families in our community facing a desperate holiday season and beyond, this congregation has increased their giving in both time and money. During our September 2nd Harvest Food Truck event, we provided boxes of fresh groceries to 214 families and engaged 24 volunteers for support. Then in October, we sponsored a yard sale featuring donated household goods and clothing. The event attracted a steady stream of shoppers, raised over \$4,200 to support our community programs, and drew over 20 enthusiastic volunteers. The Outreach team is assembling Thanksgiving food baskets now and will also offer Christmas food baskets for families of select Head Start children. Additionally, we continue to serve 42 children of the Head Start and Clovis Point elementary school and support Communities in Schools, Serve Wenatchee, and Community Action Food Pantry.

Thank you for your support of our Outreach Ministry. Please remember that our annual auction will close December 7<sup>th</sup> at 10:00.

#### **ADULT FORUM**

Adult Forum is a time for faith formation for adults, aka Sunday School for our biggest kids! This is a time to bring your questions, stories, worries, and heart to engage in your faith and wonder about what it all really means for you.

Advent is the beginning of the church year, which is an interesting place to start. It does not start with Christmas, which celebrates the coming of Christ into the world. Instead, it starts with a time of waiting, a time of reflection on the darkness and murkiness of the world and our lives when we wait for the Light of the World to guide, redeem, calm, and renew us and the world. This reflects the reality of our lives and how often we find ourselves in the dark, looking for hope and renewal.

The Adult Forum will be exploring these themes from week to week through the lens of scripture and the poetry of Mary Oliver, who encourages readers to slow down, notice what is real and true around us, and to find the hope of Christ in our every day lives. Join us for the exploration of shadows and light in our lives, 9am Sundays in the fellowship hall. Materials are provided.

#### **MEETING FOR RACIAL JUSTICE**

Pastor Sarah attended a gathering of racial justice leaders across the ELCA as the representative from our Northwest Intermountain Synod in Chicago at the ELCA Churchwide office. The gathering was an opportunity to meet new colleagues and friends, learn from other synods about their work in supportive of racial justice, be refreshed by worship (and even a sound bath experience), and learn from racial justice experts.

The beginning of our one long day of learning started with Aja Martinez and Robert Smith talk about their new book "The Origins of Critical Race Theory: The People and Ideas That Created a Movement." It was a fascinating discussion of the people involved and their intention of helping people of color in America have their stories and perspectives be heard, particularly within legal frameworks.



One aspect of race in America these presenters helped me to understand is the particularity of how white immigrants from Europe were encouraged to leave their cultural heritage behind in order to become American. This cultural amnesia is unique to the American experience. So, instead of being culturally German or Norwegian, we're all "just" American here, if we're white. This begins to explain some curiosities of our culture I have wondered about, such as why most white Americans I know have no connection with their extended families in their countries of origin and this is normal. And yet, a good friend is an Asian American woman from Chicago. While she lived in Texas for school, people often asked her "where she was from." She'd say Chicago, but that was deeply frustrating to these Texans who wanted to know her family's country of origin. The inclusion of American that is automatically extended to me is not extended to my friend. Small but telling interactions she had with people regularly.

We also learned from presenters from A Long Talk, a group that teaches people across the country their easily practiced and accessible way of helping people navigate and disarm racism in our midst. There's energy from our neighboring synods to bring this training to our larger region. I really enjoyed their training and left feeling like what they are asking us to do in response to discrimination we might witness is easily understood, done, and ultimately loving for everyone involved. They were very empowering. Stay tuned for more news on that front, if you'd like to participate in a training.

In general, it was lovely to be at Churchwide, see the art, and connect with people of good faith working to bring about justice and peace in our church for the sake of us all.



The Bishop's Convocation was held in Richland, Washington this past October. ELCA pastors from our regional synod had the opportunity to hear the news from our synod staff and bishop, connect with each other, worship, and learn from Dr. Anthony Bateza who teaches at St. Olaf College. Dr. Bateza presented on the reality of anger, outrage, resentment, and division in our world right now and what might be a healing word for us preachers to bring to our congregations. He reminded us that our relationships are what shape us most. Communities of trust and love shape us to be loving and trusting, which will help us all lay aside the stuck-ness of resentment and outrage. As people of hope and resurrection, we can together reckon with reality, be inspired by God to



respond to reality with trust and grace, and to be courageous in hope. Through relationship God transforms us and the world! The holiday season provides us a wonderful opportunity to focus on our relationships in the world and at home.

# CELEBRATION HOLIDAY PARTY



Over a meal of smoked pork sliders (wonderfully prepared by Jeremy Long!), the participants shared one take-away from the group that will serve them moving

forward in their lives. One of our participants said she was finally able to move beyond her anger. Another said she felt empowered in how she would continue to navigate grief in ways that will be healthy and safe for her. Another said the major gift for her is that she felt free to speak of her loved one again and she didn't need to hide from the loss anymore.

Barbara Weaver lovingly and gently supported the group's journey, starting from fear and disconnection and moving towards empowerment, calm, and connection. The group will be offered again starting February 12th at 6pm for 12 weeks. This group is not explicitly faith-based, so people of any faith or no faith are welcome to attend. The group is free to attend and includes a book and journal which the participants use throughout the group. Participants are encouraged to make a \$25 donation to cover the cost of the materials, if they are able to do so.




#### **FAMILY GAME NIGHT**

#### FROM DWIGHT BYERS

Greetings from Dwight

I have had so many wonderful cards, texts, and calls that I decided to respond with a quick letter to everyone to save time and effort.

First off, thank you for your outpouring of love. Sharon certainly deserved it and I really appreciate it. Everything changed so quickly. I feel like I'm two in one. The mourner who cries every morning and sometimes more, and the spiritual side that is doing great. Let me explain.

The crier. That is me missing my Sharon, wishing to share but she is no longer there. The tears are because of the love we had and that will never change. It is hard. No words can change that.

The Spirit filled. That is me remembering the good that Sharon did. Her putting others first, her love of the children and just flat out loving everyone. It is also the faith God has given me and the comfort he has sent me. Let me share some examples.

The first responders were here in 6 minutes, did their thing and had her on the way to the hospital. I could feel their love and concern for Sharon. My mind was swirling during the drive, about 40 minutes. I pray, I ask questions, imagine scenarios, etc. Upon arrival a doctor of tall intimidating stature asked, "do you want her on a ventilator? She has bad pneumonia!". My mind is far from being prepared for this. I think back to Covid times and how many died while on ventilators. I just watched my brother die who was on a ventilator for over a week. If that is the best thing for her, why do they wait to ask me? Confused, I stall and say I want to talk to family first. I fire up a prayer to God asking for wisdom. Reponse was quick. An angel (nurse) very calmly and politely asked if we could talk. She took the time to explain the benefits and cons of the ventilator in layman terms, then answered my questions, and I immediately agreed to it.

Another circumstance was bumping into a security guard that was on break seeking to warm up. He was a newer Christian, and he prayed a magnificent and powerful prayer for me and Sharon as a total stranger. Not a coincidence.

A male nurse on first meeting addressed Sharon as Miss Sharon (her preschool moniker) and she immediately asked who he was, as if he were her former student. She previously was not responding to the rest of us. God had sent her comfort through him.

About 2 months ago, Hank and I met a gentleman on our walk who we had never seen before even though he has lived within a block of us for 8 years. He shared about being a widower and how he was involved in a support group. Two days after Sharon died we run into each other again. Coincidence? I think not.

The blessings of: Niece Wendy being available to be an interpreter of Doctor talk and providing meals, of granddaughter Holly & friends dog sitting Hank for a week, of my church family for hospital visits and filling our refrigerator.

I stated my soul is good because I trust in God. I don't like what has happened, but God has a plan and has done and will do what is best. I cry, but I also am thankful for spending the last 26 years with Sharon 24/7, for 57 years in marriage, and for having a great family. The four of us (Dean & Tammy) got to spend a day together for the first time in many years the day after my brothers memorial service. What a greedy man I would be to complain about the One who has blessed me so much. I have the peace that is not possible to fully explain or understand, but is a gift from an awesome God. I wasted 60 years knowing God but not accepting Him in a true relationship. Don't be me. Learn about and accept His love, you will be glad you did.

As I try to find my new normal I will pray that you find or increase your faith to gain the love and peace God has freely offered. I am willing to answer your questions if I can. Call or text at 509-679-3568.


