Pastor Sarah's Message

Hello, Friends!

As I sit down to write to you today, the sun is bright and the spring winds are picking up. It seems our dreary, grey "non-winter" winter is coming to an end. We all know Mother Nature can have some snowy tricks up her sleeve at this point, but hopes for a healthy snowpack, overflowing water reservoirs, and an epic ski season are ebbing. The beauty of the seasons is that the glory of spring always comes, even if it is after a disappointing winter. The tulips are emerging, the buds on our beloved trees are preparing themselves for show time, and the gardeners at Celebrations' community garden are raring to go.

We are also at the beginning of Lent, the season of spiritual renewal leading up to the glory of Easter. It is a time when we too are called to prepare ourselves like the apple, cherry, and pear blossoms that are on their way. It is a time of reflection on ourselves, our lives, our families, communities, and world while wondering what is the path that is laid out before us to deepen our discipleship of Jesus. What are the logs in our own eyes (Matthew 7:5) that need tending, examining, removal, or healing? What are the obstacles or beliefs that keep us afraid to follow with our whole hearts? What in us as individuals or collectively needs to die with Christ so that we can be reborn and renewed with Christ?

Last night at the Lenten service after our soup supper, we talked about Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5) when he tells the people gathered, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of God." When we are poor in spirit, we are hopeless and at the end of our own capacities. But God is not ever at the end, always creating anew. We talked about our tendency to grasp and clench in response to our fears, but God's invitation is to open our hands to receive, open our hands to give, open our hands to invite, to love, and to pray. The invitation is to open up in trust and there we will experience the Kingdom of God, like the blossoms that come in spring even after a disappointing winter.

During this Lent and Easter season to come, let us emulate the spring blossoms that will soon surround us as they open up into their glory. The gifts of spring always come through plants and trees opening up to bloom, to leaf out, to grow, and be glorious despite the challenges of the environment. We can practice opening our hands in prayer and notice how the rest of our bodies might just s often as well as we practice receiving God's grace and goodness in our lives and into this world.

Many spring blessings to you and your families this Lent and coming Easter season!

SURVEY DATA

At the beginning of 2026, your church leadership asked you to fill out a survey about how we're doing as a church and to gather ideas for how to focus on improvement in the new year. Here's a quick summary of the results.

In general, people feel confident and positive about the quality of our administrative practices, our commitment to serving others, and knowing that they will have companionship through times of life's difficulties (60% -70% of respondents answered 10/10 on these questions). Likewise, our congregation feels supported in meaningful worship for all ages and discipleship, though with slightly less agreement on these areas (52% of respondents answered 10/10 on these questions).

The areas with the most opportunity for growth were whether we communicate well that we are a loving congregation to people outside our community and how loving and inclusive we are as a congregation. Only 18% of us thought we are doing a 10/10 job in communication and 44% feel we are a 10/10 cohesive and inclusive community.

Something important to keep in mind, for every question we asked, 90%+ of the answers were 8 or above. So, even as I'm identifying some areas of growth, Celebration folks feel pretty good about what we're up to. And that is great news! These numbers also give us a window to see how best to improve and invest effort in the coming year(s).

So, what's the bottom line? Celebration folks are looking for more:

- Fellowship and community building
- Discipleship opportunities
- Communications and sharing of the good news outside the church
- Meaningful worship opportunities for all people




Your council will look for opportunities to improve in these areas. Already under way is a new discipleship program that may be launched in the fall of 2026. We also have a communications manager working in the background to help us reach more people.

However, you may also feel some excitement to participate. For example, what if Celebration had a new Fellowship Team focused on gathering and building relationships? Do you have a love of creating fun or helping people make new friends? Or what if we put together a Fall Festival to celebrate our gardeners and invite our neighbors to? What other opportunities do you see to weave our hearts together, grow our discipleship, tell the good news, or bring worship more alive for everyone? There may be lots of opportunities that are our dangling in front of our noses. What do you see and how do you see it happening?

ADULT FORUM

During Lent, Adult Forum is studying Lutheran Theology 101 by reading through Baptized We Live by Dan Erlander. Dan was a Lutheran pastor with deep roots at Holden Village who had an amazing capacity to synthesize complex concepts in direct, accessible language. Please come join the conversation any Sunday!



We always keep Baptized We Live on our shelf of church resources, if you'd like a copy for yourself and just cannot imagine getting to church an hour early.

We are discussing potential topics for our continued shared learning for the weeks after Easter, but before our summer break.


SUNDAY SCHOOL

SUMUD

Pastor Aaron Musser of Faith Lutheran in Leavenworth, Pastor Emily Kuenker of Grace Commons in Spokane (campus ministry), and myself are now all the Sumud Ambassadors for our Northwest Intermountain Synod. Sumud is the ELCA's ministry in response to the ongoing conflict and oppression in Gaza and the West Bank. The Sumud ministry of the ELCA "is committed to accompaniment, advocacy and awareness-raising with our partners in the Holy Land and in the United States."

I was asked to be an Ambassador for this ministry in our synod because I am committed to the liberation of all people in the region. It is heartbreaking that the Holy Land is not a place of peace and deep mutual respect among the people and the three religions who claim Abraham as the father of their faiths. This is not an impossible dream and I am committed to the long work of making this hope and vision a reality.

In general, my heart in ministry is close to home. I am delighted to be a part of a congregation who gives with such freedom and generosity to provide food security to folks in need in our valley. However, the Palestinian struggle is close to my heart for two main reasons. First of all, people who I personally know and trust personally have testified that the realities on the ground in Israel and Palestine do not match the typical stories we hear in our news media. These are people who have not only studied, but have visited the Holy Land personally and have visited our fellow Christians in Palestine. When we look past the official storyline, what we find is Palestinian suffering and subjugation. Secondly, the suffering of the Palestinian people and the ongoing injustice in the region would not continue without the backing of United States and our tax dollars. Without unflagging US support, Israel would have to negotiate in good faith and be a respectful neighbor. The suffering would stop.

Jesus told us that he is with the poor, the suffering, the oppressed, the imprisoned, and the hungry. There are many people who suffer around us close to home and around the world. However, the suffering of the Palestinian people is acute as the Israeli government continues their campaign of removal and genocide. It only continues because of us, our funding and diplomatic cover.

Thus, Sumud exists to provide education, opportunities for engagement, accompanied travel to the Holy Land, and resources. We will be creating a newsletter list to send out stories, resources, advocacy alerts, and some good news, as well. The Sumud ministry in our synod is brand new and is just getting started. Please reach out to me if you're interested in helping us pastors get this ministry off the ground!

IN MEMORY OF TODD PENSION

Previous member and longtime friend of Celebration Lutheran, Todd Pension died February 20, 2026 in Union, Washington at 88 years old.

Born in Tacoma WA, Richard Gotfred Peterson, known as Dick, grew up in Eugene Oregon, graduated from Eugene High School and in 1960 graduated from Pacific Lutheran University. He married Muriel Swenson in the same year in Parkland, WA. Over the next six years, he and Muriel grew their family to six, adding David, Kathy, Julie and Doug.

Hearing the call of God for fulltime Christian ministry, he moved to Rock Island, IL for seminary training at Augustana Lutheran Theological Seminary. His internship was at Brainard, MN.


Being ordained in 1960, he began by serving a 3-point parish in Alberta, Canada. This was the beginning of many adventures in ministry which took them next to New Westminster, BC, and then to The United States: Kirkland, WA, Kingsburg, CA, Greeley, CO, Sequim, WA, Portland, OR, McDonough, GA and Hot Springs Village, AR. where he retired in 2003.

He also served as Missionary Pastor, Hospital chaplain, and teacher in upper Liberia, Africa from 1987-1990. After the Liberian war, he built and funded a K-12 school for 200 war-orphaned children.

In 2002, he changed his name to Todd Richard Pension. That was the beginning of a series of ministries in Lithuania, Europe, Wrangel, AK and in Washington state and Tucson Arizona.

He enjoyed hiking, golfing, working out, eating cinnamon rolls, traveling, and of course, being Dad, Grandpa, Great Grandpa and Uncle to his family. Todd and Tyger were happily married for 66 yrs.





