## Pastor Sarah's Message

Dear Celebration!

As you receive this newsletter, the church will have just finished walking through the story of Jesus' life, beginning with Advent in December and culminating with Easter, Pentecost, and finally Holy Trinity Sunday. Once the green banners go up for June 7th Sunday, they don't come down for months. The liturgical arts and altar guild folks get a little breathing room for almost six months! However, that doesn't mean there's nothing happening spiritually.

These extended weeks of Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time, are a time when we focus on Jesus' life and ministry. We get to wonder about what he taught, what he was like, and how that relates to us.

The events of Jesus' life were so dramatic, they take a lot of our time and attention. Jesus did indeed become incarnate for us and die for us, but he also lived for us. In between these big events, Jesus also just lived his life. There were ordinary days for him, too. Through his living and his ministry, he taught us mercy and demonstrated hospitality and inclusion, pointing always to God and the deep mystery of our inclusion in God's life, being, and Creation.

The ordinary is no less sacred than the extraordinary. However, it might require a bit more of our attention for us to notice and nurture the extraordinariness of our ordinary days. We can take care to notice the beauty of blooming flowers or expanses of green lawns. We can let the sounds of the ice cream truck or playing children penetrate our distracted minds to remind us of simple joys. We can turn mundane, ordinary tasks into spiritual practice simply through mindful presence.

God's intention for us is to live abundantly with love, joy, faith, connection, and hope. However, these gifts can easily come and go without our notice if we are not attentive to our ordinary days. Perhaps the gift and opportunity of Ordinary Time is to practice being receptive to Jesus' example, his teaching, and simply to what already is. As Meister Eckart wrote, "Be prepared at all times for the gifts of God and be ready always for new ones. For God is a thousand times more ready to give than we are to receive."

The cultivation of our readiness to receive may indeed prepare us for the journey of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection once again. But for now, we have the gift of Ordinary Time to notice, receive, and be renewed.

May your coming summer be full of the blessings of the season.

**MEET OUR MEMBERS: PASTOR NANCY GRADWOHL**

I was born the last day of February in 1939 and baptized 3 weeks later on St. Patrick's Day at St. John's Danish Lutheran Church in Seattle. This congregation was where my parents were baptized and confirmed!! I spent my first five years as the only child in a Danish retirement community on Puget Sound, beachcombing, gardening, and feasting on Danish cookies. My mom and dad were very active in the Danish organizations, and I have wonderful memories of those days: a stand-out--dancing around the Christmas tree at the Danish Hall with my grandpa. When I was five, we moved to Seattle, I started school and attended a neighborhood church. When I returned from a huge Luther League gathering in Canada, my pastor at Magnolia Lutheran invited me to deliver a message to the congregation. I was hooked, but women were not ordained at that time, so when I graduated from Queen Anne High, I headed to Pacific Lutheran and got a teaching degree. In those days (the late 50's), the president of PLU thought social dancing was sinful, so I became a cheerleader and our "team" danced our socks off at all the games! We found a way.



Along the way I have had various jobs. I began as a babysitter and then "advanced" to sales clerk, file clerk, substitute teacher, preschool teacher, teachers' aide. What a surprise to find myself in my 40's cleaning stalls on the back side of racetracks! Then on to being a caretaker on an estate *and* an upholstery seamstress!

I married a PLU grad and we blessed the 60's with six sons: Christian, Gordon, John, Peter, Paul and Matthew. There were many trips to the emergency room and gazillions of sports events to attend! I am incredibly proud of the men they have become. Much, much credit goes to PLU football coach, Frosty Westering.

While teaching middle school, I took some theology classes at Seattle U. and after retiring from teaching, I spent time as a pastoral assistant at Edmonds Lutheran Church. The pastor, Julie Josund, encouraged me to pursue a Masters of Divinity and ordination. I was accepted at PLTS in Berkeley despite my age and even received a student loan which I will never live long enough to pay back!! I did have some doubt when I got to Berkeley and my first class was Greek! (This old lady got an "A".) My first call was to Island of Faith in Wrangell AK and next to Faith Lutheran in Leavenworth during the Covid years. The cross-cultural experience in seminary, living for 10 days as a street person in San Francisco, made a huge impact on me and I couldn't put it aside; a strong call to serve the homeless led me to resign from Faith and seek opportunities to work with the homeless. Jesus said it, and it is true—I have experienced HIS presence with the poor, hungry, sick—the least of these.

We studied Old Testament stories from Adam and Eve, to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph. We also had several stories involving Moses. We ended the year with the life and teachings of Jesus, his death and resurrection, then Pentecost, Stephen, and Paul. It has been a great year with some pretty awesome kids. We feel blessed to be able to visit and share Bible stories and faith lessons with them on a regular basis. ### BLESSING OF THE QUILTS

Celebration had a quilt blessing in the Spring, blessing 30 of the 250 quilts made at Grace Lutheran Church in Cashmere. Susan Gubsch and Terry Johns participate in the quilt group which meets on Tuesdays each week, in Cashmere, between 9 and 11 a.m. Helene Fink is also beginning to lend a hand.

Quilt gathering is done in our area in April, in a 3 or 4 county area. Quilts arrive in Baltimore to be stored for a short time in many large warehouses, eventually being shipped all over the world to needy individuals. 315,181 quilts were sent to countries all over the world, such as Angola, Honduras, Jordan, Liberia, Ukraine and to East, Central and West USA.

### SYNOD ASSEMBLY

Thank you for the opportunity to represent Celebration at the Northwest Intermountain Synod Assembly this past April. Some highlights included the assembly passing a resolution on the World Council of Churches Ecumenical Decade of Climate Justice Action, passing a Memorial Rejecting Christian Nationalism, and elections for open synod positions. We enjoyed the worship, sharing food and conversation with those from other churches, all the workshops (including ‘Learning to Speak Lutheran about Gender Justice’ and ‘Monarchs and Migration’), and the music!

On May 2nd, Pastor Paul Palumbo of Lake Chelan Lutheran came to Celebration to present an introductory experience of Liturgy and Life, a faith formation experience for adults to explore every aspect of the liturgy and how it connects to our lives. The Lutheran pattern of worship, our liturgy, largely follows the pattern of worship of Christians for centuries. Because it's just the way we do worship, it is easy to miss the depth of meaning that is woven into the steps of liturgy. Liturgy and Life is a way to explore that depth and to help us open up each and every Sunday into a new world of meaning, connection, and hope.

Pr. Paul led a sample of this program with the group consisting primarily of lay people from Celebration, Grace, and Lake Chelan Lutheran churches. A question was posed at the end: do we want to do the full program together starting in the fall? The answer was a unanimous and enthusiastic yes! Celebration and Grace are likely to join together for this experience with Pastor Sarah of Celebration. Stay tuned for more details!

Valdine Collinge died on April 10th, 2026, with family close by. She and her husband Duane were long-time members of Celebration Lutheran Church. Her memorial is scheduled for June 27th at 2pm at Celebration.

Valdine Carol Collinge (Peterson) was born on April 19, 1933, in Chewelah, Washington, and passed away peacefully, surrounded by her loving family, on April 10, 2026, in Wenatchee, Washington, just nine days shy of her 93rd birthday.

Valdine grew up on a farm near Addy, Washington, where she met her future husband, Duane Collinge. She graduated from Sacred Heart Nursing School in Spokane and married Duane on September 19, 1954, in Chewelah. The couple settled in Wenatchee, where they raised their four children. Valdine worked part-time as a registered nurse at Deaconess Hospital before joining the ENT department at Wenatchee Valley Clinic (now Confluence Health) in 1971. She served there with dedication until her retirement in 1998.

Valdine and Duane shared a love of travel, embarking on adventures to Japan, Greece, Europe, as well as many trips to Mexico and Hawaii. They especially cherished a trip to Switzerland with their mothers and they celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary abroad. Valdine also enjoyed RV camping with the Good Sams Club, boating on Lake Chelan, and spending time with family around the pool. Her hobbies included bowling, reading, solving word puzzles, quilting for Lutheran World Relief through her church, and gardening – particularly tending to her roses and vegetable garden.

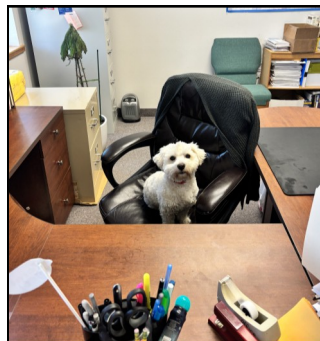

**OUTREACH MINISTRY**

First of all, the members of the Outreach Committee would like to thank all who participated and donated through the 2025 auction and yard sale. The yard sale raised a little over \$ 4,500, the auction raised \$ 3,500 and the Easter grocery card funding request raised \$ 550.

Since October 1, 2025 we have donated \$ 600 to Serve Wenatchee for their Baskets of Blessing and Glory of Christmas campaigns, \$ 500 each to Communities in Schools, Grace House: a safe, Christ centered home for women in East Wenatchee (to help replace their roof) and Chelan/Douglas Counties Community Action Council, \$ 960 for Easter grocery gift cards for select participants of our Packing Friendships program, a little over \$ 2,400 to the Packing Friendship Ministry, and \$ 500 for the fall visit of the 2nd Harvest Food Truck on September 12th.

We currently serve 42 children in the Celebration Packing Friendship Ministry. We would like to extend a special thanks to the Community Action Council for allowing access to their market for free groceries as they are available, resulting in significant savings.

We are planning our 2026 auction for November 8th, 15th and 22nd and we will be organizing our next yard sale for May, 2027 (start setting donations aside!).

In closing, we recognize that this ministry is an extension of the community interest and generosity of this congregation, and I hope that from what you have read above you can see that YOUR GIFT MATTERS.

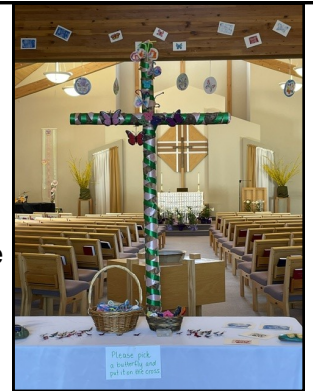

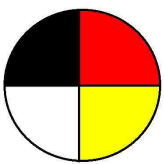
**EASTER SUNDAY JOY**



